We are providing grants to those who have had damage to their homes so that they can begin to rebuild. This will continue until all funds are depleted. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) helps coordinate the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)'s humanitarian response to and advocacy on behalf of refugees, asylum seekers, and other forced migrants.

The Community Response Coalition of Kentucky, Inc. (CRCKY, <u>crc4me.org</u>) is a local 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization that has been serving our immigrant communities since 2018. Maxwell Street Presbyterian Church was an essential part of its founding and continue to support its operations, with MSPC members serving as volunteers, board members, and donors. The MSPC Endowment Fund has provided consistent annual financial support.

But there are insufficient reasonably priced legal services in Central Kentucky to meet the current needs.

CRCKY is forging an innovative path to expanding. CRCKY now also offers low-or-no-cost immigration legal services, as well. Our legal clinic offers free services to clients who have affirmative claims, meaning these clients are not in removal proceedings.

CRCKY became a DOJ-approved site in December 2024, allowing them to practice immigration law in certain settings. More specifically, the work before the US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) for immigration benefits can be done by Partially Accredited DOJ Representatives, who are non-lawyers with extensive training in immigration law. CRCKY has three. Though they are not legally required to have supervision from an immigration attorney, they nevertheless utilize best practice by having a licensed immigration attorney review their work. To assist with this movement from partially to fully accredited DOJ representatives, CRCKY needs an inhouse immigration attorney, who can represent clients in Immigration Court and supervise the accredited representatives in their transition from partial to full accreditation.

What a blessing to be a part of a connectional church - where Presbyterians across the world show up for one another, as we work to make God's love for this world real.

Caring Ministry
