

Wednesday, **February 17th**, was the first day of Lent. In past years we have had a canned goods challenge and a clothing challenge. This year we have a different challenge for you! We are calling it a **\$0.40** for **40** challenge. We know that at the end of the day most people have some change in their pocket or purse. Instead of dropping it into a large jar or giving it away, we are asking that you take that change and place it in an envelope or small container and then donate it to the Mission Committee to use for your food pantry. This will allow us to purchase meat and other staples that are not free. At the end of Lent, drop off your donation at the church, or bring it Sunday to our church service. We will use your donation to further our mission and the work of God. \$0.40 may not seem like much but if we get 50 members and friends to donate \$0.40 a day (\$16.00 total) that would amount to \$800.00 for your Mission Committee. The book brings a hopeful and contemplative take on the cross during the weeks of Lent. We will be joining together virtually at 7 on Wednesday evenings, and the class will conclude on March 31.
